



**FEE PAYMENT FOR APPLICATIONS AND PETITIONS FILED WITH
 U.S. CITIZENSHIP AND IMMIGRATION SERVICES, MANILA FIELD OFFICE**

Area Of Responsibility

U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services, Manila Field Office ("USCIS Manila") accepts and adjudicates U.S. immigration benefits filed by residents of: The Philippines, New Guinea, Micronesia, Marshall Islands, Palau, Kiribati, Tuvalu, Fiji, Vanuatu, Solomon Islands, Tonga, Samoa, Wallis, Futuna, New Caledonia, Pitcairn Island, and Overseas French territories of French Polynesia.

Residency

USCIS Manila only accepts applications and petitions from an individual who can establish residency in one of the countries listed above. Section 101(a)(33) of the Immigration and Nationality Act defines residence" as the "place of general abode; the place of general abode of the person means his principal, actual dwelling place in fact, without regard to intent."

Paying Fees In Person

Fees may be paid in person in the Consular Section of the U.S. Embassy, Manila:

The Embassy cashier is open every weekday (except Philippine and U.S. holidays) from 7:00 A.M. to 12:00 P.M. and from 1:00 P.M. to 3:00 P.M. Follow the steps below to pay for any USCIS application or petition requiring a fee:

- (1) Visit USCIS' Information Counter (Window 35) any weekday between 8:00 A.M. and 12:00 P.M. (except Philippine and U.S. holidays);
- (2) Provide the completed Form Number/Type and supporting documentary information;
- (3) Receive a payment referral slip;
- (4) Visit the U.S. Embassy cashier (Window C1 or C2);
- (5) Pay the appropriate fee utilizing one of the payment methods indicated below;
- (6) Obtain 2 receipts (Customer Copy and State Department Copy); and
- (7) Return to USCIS' Information Counter (Window 35) and deliver the State Department copy of the payment receipt before 12:00 P.M.

Payment of fees at the U.S. Embassy, Manila is limited to the following methods:

- Cash in U.S. dollars or the equivalent in Philippine pesos;
- Credit Card (Visa, Mastercard, American Express, or Diner's Club);
- U.S. Postal Money Order in the exact amount; or
- Traveler's Check (at least 60% must be paid in traveler's checks to receive change in U.S. dollars or Philippine pesos).

Paying Fees Through The Mail Or By Commercial Courier

Although USCIS Manila will accept fee payment along with completed applications and petitions and supporting documentation through the mails or by commercial courier, in-person filing is strongly encouraged.

Payment through the mails is limited to U.S. Postal Money Orders. Personal or law firm checks, money orders other than those issued by the United States Postal Service, credit card information, and traveler's checks are not accepted. USCIS is not responsible for non-receipt of payment that is lost or stolen through the mails or courier services.

Applications and petitions, fees, and supporting documents mailed **via commercial courier service (DHL, FedEx, LBC, DelBros, Air21, etc.) and Philippine postal service** may be sent to the following address:
