- 4. for immigrant visa applicants – I-864 Affidavit of Support
- 5. police certificate
- 6. photographs
- 7. evidence of relationship with your fiancé(e)/spouse – written correspondence, photographs, phone records, skype logs, travels etc.
- 8. marriage certificate or change of name certificate
- 9. divorce certificate
- 10. notarized statement from an absent parent along with the photocopy of the photo and signature pages of his/her passport
- 11. court decree of sole legal custody of the child
- 12. court decree pronouncing the other parent missing
- 13. adoption decree
- 14. military records
- 15. death certificate

STATEMENT: I **have in my possession and am prepared to present all the documents** where applicable listed in items 1 through 13 which apply to my case, as indicated by the check mark I have placed in the appropriate boxes. **I fully realize that no advance assurance can be given when or whether a visa will actually be issued to me and I also understand that I should NOT give up my job, dispose of property, or make any final travel arrangements until I receive the passport with the visa.**
