

Dear Sir or Madam:

In compliance with the International Marriage Broker Regulation Act (IMBRA), I respectfully request for a waiver on the filing limitations/ multiple filing's in connection with my current petition. A waiver is appropriate in my circumstance because I have no criminal history with regard to the "specified crimes" under IMBRA.

I have two prior approved Form's I-129F for:

- Jovilyn Silvano Simon, of the Republic of the Philippines. Receipt # MSC0223262280 filed on May 20, 2002, for a **K3** visa from our Marriage on March 25,2002. She abandoned me on December 15, 2013, and subsequently filed for divorce that was finalized on September 22,2014.

The above aforementioned petition was not previously disclosed due to my error. It was my understanding that only K1 petitions needed to be disclosed. I pray that this has remedied the deficiency.

- Charisse Albarracin Maghanoy, of the Republic of the Philippines, Receipt #r WAC1690628818 filed On September 15, 2016, for a K1 Visa. I had sent her all monies for travel, filing and medical fees for an Interview at the US Embassy in Manila, Philippines. She informed me that she was denied. I later found out through correspondence with the embassy that she did not take the required medical exam nor attend the required interview. The relationship ended at that time and on May 4, 2017, I sent a letter to the USCIS requesting withdrawal of the petition.

Evidence to support this waiver includes:

- Proof or Marriage to Jovilyn Silvano Simon on March 25,2002.
- Proof of Divorce from Jovilyn Silvano Simon on September 22, 2014
- Email Correspondence with the US embassy located in Manila, Philippines
- Copy of my letter to the USCIS dated May 4, 2017, requesting the withdrawal of the previous I29F.
