You are now ready for an interview at the U.S. Consulate General in Montreal, where all interviews for immigration to the US from Canada are processed. This letter provides information on the next steps you must take to continue with your immigrant visa case.

Schedule your visa interview appointment

Please visit https://ais.usvisa-info.com/en-CA/tv/information/contact_us to obtain information online or via telephone concerning scheduling an interview appointment for you and those family members included in the petition. If you have not previously registered your information and selected a CANADA POST location on this website, please do so now.

Q1. Should I be worried that Montreal still is showing old mailing address for my fiancé?

Q2. Do I need the original Packet 4, because that would have been sent to my Fiancé old address and won't make it until after interview to his new address.

Medical exam

Each intending immigrant, regardless of age, is required to have a medical examination, and submit the results on the day of the interview. To schedule a medical examination, please visit <https://travel.state.gov/content/travel/en/us-visas/immigrate/the-immigrant-visa-process/interview/interview-prepare/medical-examination.html> and select Montreal as your case processing post at step 2.

IMPORTANT: "please bring this letter and the appointment confirmation sheet you will receive from <http://canada.usvisa.info.com/> to the panel physician medical appointment."

The day of your interview

Please bring to your interview the original and one photocopy of each of the following documents (as applicable), for each applicant:

- The appointment letter showing the date and time of your interview
- Passport valid for at least 6 months beyond the date you plan to enter the United States

— Birth certificate (Petitioner and Beneficiary)

- Adoptions decree (s)
- Marriage certificate (s)
- Death and/or divorce certificate(s)

— Police certificates from each country in which the applicant has resided for one year or longer. The certificate(s) must be issued within one year of the date of the visa appointment. NOTE: An applicant must present a police certificate from his/her country of current residence and country of nationality, if residence in such country exceeds 6 months

- Court records
- Military records
- Evidence of domicile in the United States
- Job offer letter (for employment-based visas)
- Affidavit of support (I-134) (for fiancé, employment and DV visas)
- Evidence of support (I-864, Federal individual income tax return for the most recent tax year)
- Medical examination
- Two photographs (in color)
- For K visa applicants, a letter of intent to marry signed by the petitioner within 30 days of interview date

Q3. I was born in India and my original birth certificate was translated to English, does my Fiancé need either originals or just copies?

Q4. My Fiancé is traveling back to Canada on December 3rd, and I am unsure if that is enough time to get Police certificate with fingerprints – any advice for those that have had interviews were you asked just the certificate or fingerprints or both?

Q5. For Domicile in the US - I am sending him copy of my US citizenship certificate and copies of passport the front and last page? Anything else? Do I need to send the original certificate of citizenship?

Q6. I know at the bottom it says Packet 4 but just confirming it this is it. This was sent in our email. Do we need the original they will mail?

Q7. This is related to the original 129F application, do I need the pictures that were sent originally or it can be any pics of our engagement. Because I do not remember exactly what pictures I sent.

My fiancé to show proof of our relationship has:

- Photo album of engagement
- Photo album of our meeting in June and July
- Our chats on phone
- Our emails chats
- And 4x6 pics of engagement ceremony, meetings in June/ July and our gathering pics of us in India at his house in October. ---we did this on top of album in case they want to keep the pics for evidence.
- Receipt of engagement rings, engagement hall and photographer.
- Receipt of flight reservation for our initial meeting-engagement-India trip, hotel and car rental and food receipts.
- Also will send him receipt of my wedding outfit and jewelry as I did my wedding shopping in India.
- Letter from the temple for booking of our wedding religiously and for reception etc will wait until after the visa.
- Affidavit from my Fiancé side that attended the engagement.
