USCIS Atlanta Office moves to a new location

Atlanta, FL – The Atlanta Field Office of U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) will move to a new location effective February 20, 2007. The last day of business at the current location is Friday, February 16, 2007. The new, modern and spacious facility will allow the USCIS Atlanta District to provide the most efficient customer service possible to the more than five hundred individuals who visit each day.

The new office is located at 2150 Parklake Drive, Atlanta, GA 30045. The office will open to the public on Wednesday, February 21, 2007.

“This is a wonderful thing for our applicants”, explains Denis Riordan, Acting District Director. “A better facility means better service, more efficiency and a wonderful work environment for both applicant and employees.”

This facility is a four-story office building customized specifically for the Atlanta District. The Information unit, the Adjustment of Status unit and the Naturalization unit each have spacious, comfortable waiting areas for the applicants. The Naturalization unit boasts a very large ceremony room. There will be plenty of free parking available for the public.

Until this coming Friday, the old locations are 77 Forsyth St, Atlanta and 6655 Peachtree Dunwoody Rd, Dunwoody.

Each year, USCIS welcomes more than 450,000 citizens during naturalization ceremonies across the United States. Included in those numbers are more than 10,000 members of the armed forces who have naturalized through an expedited process related to their military service.

On March 1, 2003, U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) became one of three former INS components to join the U.S. Department of Homeland Security.
