nt Authorization Document (EADs) based on their parole (category (c)(11)). This action reverted previously approved

d (c)(11) EADs to a pending status. In April 2025, a stay was issued (Svitlana Doe, et al., v. Noem, et. al., No. 25-cv-1

0495 (D. Mass. Apr. 14, 2025)) , which temporarily halted the implementation of those actions. As a result, the pend

ling (c)(11) EADs were reverted back to an approved status. These actions resulted in significant changes in pending

and completed (c)(11) EADs. This report reflects operational activity during a specific time period only.
